Bright Future Ahead: RORC Fields Get a Major Upgrade



We're thrilled to announce the completion of an exciting new upgrade at the Ridgefield Outdoor Recreation Complex (RORC) – the installation of eight massive 80-foot field lights for Fields 4 and 5! This project will significantly increase the availability and usage of the complex, making it possible for residents to enjoy evening games and activities year-round. Whether it's a late-night soccer practice or a weekend baseball tournament, the new lights ensure that the fun doesn't stop when the sun goes down.

When RORC was built, the foundations, controls and wiring for lights for fields 4 and 5 were put in place, but the actual lights were omitted due to budget constraints. Our Washington State Legislators in the 20th and 18th districts successfully advocated for state funding for the lighting to be included in the State Capital Budget for community projects. Thank you to Senators John Braun and Ann Rivers and Representatives Peter Abbarno, Ed Orcutt, Greg Cheney and Stephanie McClinton.

The new lights will not only expand playtime but also enhance the overall experience at RORC, creating more opportunities for recreation and bringing our community together. We can't wait to see you out there enjoying the fields under the bright new lights! Let's keep making Ridgefield a vibrant and active place to live, work, and play!

Paradise Pointe Park Master Plan

Design concepts are in development for the Paradise Pointe Park Master Plan. Community members are encouraged to attend the Open House on **November 6th** to provide input, review initial concepts, and learn more about the project.

Waterfront Park Master Plan

The Waterfront Park Master Plan has been approved by Port Commission and City Council. The City and Port of Ridgefield will work together to secure funding and advance to the design and construction phases.

Boyse Park

Phase 1 is advancing with exciting amenities, including a pump track, gravel parking lot, and open spaces for various recreational uses. The city will soon seek a contractor to lead the design-build process, with project completion anticipated in 2025.
